- 3rd **St. Denis, the Areopagite**, Priest-Martyr, first Bishop of Athens, converted by St. Paul, the Apostle and, with him, **Rusticus** and **Eleutherius**, Athenian converts.
- 4th **St. Hierotheus, Priest-Martyr**, Bishop of Athens, disciple of St. Paul. Tradition has it that he was translated on a cloud to Jerusalem to be present at the Dormition (*Assumption*) of the Blessed Virgin Mary. **Venerable St Francis of Assisi.**
- 5^{th} **St. Charitina,** Martyr, suffered Martyrdom A.D. 304, at Amasa on the Black Sea, under Emperor Diocletian.
- 6^{th} **St. Thomas,** the Glorious Apostle, otherwise called Didymus (twin). He is stated to have preached the Gospel in Pathia, in Media and in India, where he is said to have suffered martyrdom.
- 7th **SS. Sergius and Bacchus, Martyrs,** were officers, in the Imperial Army and were put to death A.D. 296, during the reign of Maximian
- 8th **Our Venerable Mother Pelagia.** Public sinner, but later penitent in a cave on Mt. Olivet near Jerusalem. Pelagia died A.D. 457.
- 9th **St. James the Lesser, Son of Alpheus,** Apostle and Brother of St. Matthew, the Apostle and Evangelist. **Our Venerable Father Andronicus and his wife, Athanasia,** from Antioch of Syria. On the death of their children, they agreed to separate and, thenceforth, led lives of prayer and penance in the solitude of Upper-Egypt.
- 10th **SS. Eulampius and his sister, Eulampia,** Martyrs at Nicomedia A.D. 302, under the reign of Maximian Herculeus. They were young children who, for their Faith, were cast into a cauldron of boiling oil, but miraculously came out unhurt and; thereupon, were beheaded. Two hundred soldiers, witnessing this, became converts and were put to death as Christians.
- 11th **St. Phillip, One of the Seven Deacons**, converted the Samaritans, baptized the Eunuch of Candace, Queen of Ethiopia (*Acts 8*), and was the host of St. Paul at Caesarea (*Acts 21.8*). His four daughters are honored as Saints with him. He became Bishop of Tralles, Lydia and there, suffered martyrdom.

The Byzantine Catholic Seminary of Saints Cyril and Methodius is pleased to host the "Come and See" Weekend of Discovery on Friday, November 6, and Saturday, November 7, 2020. This year's retreat will be given virtually online.

Invited to register for this online retreat are men, ages 18 to 35, single or married, who may be considering a vocation to the priesthood in the Byzantine Catholic Church. In the interests of facilitating the necessary disconnection from the world, this year's challenge of a virtual weekend includes creating as much as possible an atmosphere that is prayerful, positive, and fraternal. A selection of pre-recorded talks introducing the Seminary formation program will be offered as well as a recorded witness talk with the seminarians. A panel discussion will be live-streamed along with at least one liturgical service.

One of last year's participants summed up his experience, saying: "Discerning God's Will is important for me; I have been personally praying in front of my icon corner at home and at the Divine Liturgy asking for a clearer understanding of God's Will for me for a long time and, attending this weekend, was a significant part of my continued discernment."






