Readings: Eph 6:10-17; Heb 13:17-21; Lk 17:12-19; Lk 6:17-23

28th – St. Stephen, “the Younger”. Venerable Martyr suffered martyrdom with 343 other Christians, victims of the fury of the Iconoclast Emperor Constantine Copronymus, A.D. 766. — **St. Irenarchus, and Seven Women, Martyrs**, who suffered death with him, A.D. 292.

29th – SS. Paramon and Philemonus, Martyrs; the former martyred during the reign of Emperor Decius, A.D. 250; the latter under Aurelian, Emperor. — **Our Venerable Father, Bessarion.** — **Venerable, Acacius**, spoken of in “The Ladder of Perfection.”

30th – St. Andrew, the “First-called” Apostle, brother of St. Peter the Prince of the Apostles. He was a disciple of St. John the Baptist. Tradition has it that he was crucified on a cross shaped in the form of an X at Patras in Achiia (Greece) A.D. 60, under the reign of Nero, Emperor.

1st – St. Nahum, Prophet. One of the Minor Prophets, lived in the 7th century B.C. He saw the fulfillment of his prophecy of the destruction of Nineve. — **St. Filaret, the “Almsgiver” and St. Ananias, Martyrs.**

2nd – St. Habakkuk, one of the twelve minor prophets of the tribe of Simeon, lived in the 5th century B.C. His relics were discovered in the reign of the Emperor Theodosius the Great about A.D. 379.

3rd – St. Zephaniah, Prophet, said to be of the Tribe of Simeon, foretold the judgments of God upon Jerusalem and the ultimate conversion of the Jews. He lived in the 7th century B.C. — **Our Venerable Father, Theodulus**, was Prefect of Constantinople A.D. 320.

4th – St. Barbara, Great Martyr, endured death A.D. 290, during the reign of Diocletian and Maximianus, Emperors. — **Our Venerable Father, St. John Damascene**, Doctor of the Church, born in Syria, educated by St. Comas, succeeded his father as the Caliph’s Vizier. He distributed his possessions among the poor, retired to the monastery of St. Sabbas at Jerusalem. Laboring and writing much, he championed the “Faith against the Iconoclast” Emperor Leo the Isaurian, and was sentenced to have his right hand cut off. It was miraculously restored by Our Blessed Lady. By him was composed the beautiful “Canon of the Resurrection.” He lived to be 104 years old; died in the 2nd half of the 8th century A.D.

5th – Our Venerable and Divinely Inspired Father, St. Sabbas, Hegumen-Abbot. He rendered great service to the Eastern Church against the Eutychian heretics. He died at the age of 94, A.D. 532, in the reign of the Emperor Justinian the Great.

6th – Our Holy Father, Nicholas, Archbishop of Myra in Lycia, the “Wonderworker.” He is the Patron of the Byzantine Rite Catholic Faithful. He also used his large inheritance to assist the poor. He is a very popular Saint among the various nations; also here in the U.S.A. He died in the middle of the 4th century A.D. (*Confer May 9*).
