13th – Our Holy Father, St. John Chrysostom, Archbishop of Constantinople, most famous of both the Greek and the Latin Church and one of the four great Doctors of the Orient, called “Golden-Tongued” because of his eloquence. The Catholic Church honors him as the “Heavenly Patron of Ecclesiastical Orators.” He revised St. Basil’s Divine Liturgy. He suffered deposition and exile for his firm stand against the dissolute life at the Court of the Emperor Arcadius and Honorius. He died at Comana in Cappadocia, at the age of 62, A.D. 407 (*confer January 27 and 30*).

14th – St. Philip, one of the Twelve, was born in Bethsaida, in the town of SS. Andrew and Peter, Apostles; preached in Phrygia (Asia Minor) and was crucified in Hieropolis by Hellens A.D. 80, head down like St. Peter, Apostle. His three daughters were blessed with the gift of prophesy. He introduced Nathanael “a true Israelite in whom there is no guile,” to Jesus.

15th – SS. Gurias, Samonas, and Habib, Martyrs, at Edessa in Syria, were beheaded A.D. 299, under Emperor Diocletian.

16th – St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. His early Apostolic work was concerned with the Jews for whom he wrote his First Gospel in their own Aramaic tongue. He was martyred in Africa by fire.

17th – Our Holy Father Gregory, “Taumaturgus,” i.e., Wonderworker, Bishop in Neocaesarea: died A.D. 270 in the reign of Emperor Aurelian. Tradition states that he was instructed concerning the Holy Trinity by the Theotokos and St. John the Evangelist.

18th – SS. Plato and Roman, Martyrs. The former suffered death A.D. 296; the latter A.D. 304.

19th – St. Obadiah, Prophet, is of the Twelve Minor Prophets, having lived in the 9th century B.C. — **St. Barlam, Martyr**, was a pious peasant, who was imprisoned and tortured for the Faith at Antioch A.D. 304, in the persecution under Diocletian and Galerius, Emperors.

20th – Our Venerable Father, Gregory of Decapolis, suffered much in the Iconoclastic persecution under the Emperor Leo the Armenian. — **Our Holy Father, Proclus**, Archbishop of Constantinople, was a disciple of St. John Chrysostom. He died A.D. 446, in the reign of Theodosius the Younger, Emperor.

21st – Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple (*This Feast was introduced in Constantinople about the year A.D. 700.*)

PHILLIPS FAST BEGINS NOVEMBER 14th — *The feast of the Nativity of Our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ (Christmas, December 25) is one of the great feasts of the Church year, celebrating the coming or advent of the Messiah (which in Hebrew means “He who is anointed by the Spirit” or, in Greek, Christos), Jesus Christ. Christ was born into the world through the Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary to offer us the wondrous gifts of salvation and Theosis, our transformation into the likeness of God by sharing in His Holiness through the energies of His Grace. Through the mystery we celebrate in the Nativity, we too are invited to become the children of God, sons and daughters of our Heavenly Father. But, this transformation does not occur overnight. Rather, it requires a rediscovery of the essential disciplines of a disciple of Jesus Christ.*
