7th – **Synaxis of St. John**, the glorious Prophet, Precursor, and Baptist, who baptized our Lord Jesus Christ in the River Jordan.

8th – Our Venerable Father, **George**, The Chozebite and Emilian, Confessor. They were martyred A.D. 820, in the reign of Nicephorus Gennicus. — Our Venerable Mother, **Dominika**, of Carthage, who lived in the year A.D. 374, in the reign of Theodosius the Great. — **SS. Juliana and Basilissa**, martyred A.D. 300, during the reign of Diocletian, Emperor.

9th - **St. Polyeucte, Martyr**, suffered death A.D. 244, during the reign of the Decius or Valerianus. — **Eustratius**, Venerable, endured death in the reign of Leo Icomachus, Emperor

10th - Our Holy Father, **Gregory, Bishop of Nyssa**, consecrated in A.D. 372, brother of St. Basil the Great. Died A.D. 395. — **Dometian**, Venerable, Bishop of Melite, died A.D. 570, in the reign of Justinus the Younger — Our Venerable Father, Marcian, Presbyter and Treasurer of the great Church of Holy Wisdom; died A.D. 489.

11th - Our Venerable Father, **Theodosius**, Hegumen-Abbot died in A.D. 485, in the reign of Leo and Anastatius, Emperors, at the age of 105.

12th - **St. Tatiana**, Martyr, lived in A.D. 227, in the reign of Alexander. Her father, was a Soldier and Elder of the city; after many tortures, she died by the sword along with her father.

13th - **SS. Hermolaus and Stratonicus**, Martyrs: Deacon of Singudunum (Belgrade) and his servant were tortured and drowned in the River Danube A.D. 315, under Licinius, Emperor.

14th - Our Venerable **Father of Sinai and Raitho**, suffered martyrdom from the Sarcens A.D. 296, during the reign of Diocletian, Emperor.

This week we have our Canon Law Conference for the Eparchy of Phoenix. All of our Presbyterate will be here. This conference is being held at our parish. While many of the Canon's are Eastern, most of our code of canon law comes from the Roman Canon. Our canon law book is called The Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches (CCEO). In our Mother Churches, the Eastern Orthodox Churches, their collection, which partly informs ours, is known as the Rudder. The Rudder (Greek: Πηδάλιον) is a collection of the texts of Orthodox Canon law by St. Nicodemus of the Holy Mountain. It was first translated into English by D. Cummings, and published by the Orthodox Christian Educational Society in 1957 under the title of The Rudder. In addition to the texts of the canons, Nicodemus includes his own commentary. You can peruse the texts by plugging in The Rudder - OrthodoxWiki in your Google engine.
