10th – **St. Timothy**, Priest-Martyr, Bishop of Prusia in Bithynia (Asia Minor), suffered death in the persecution under Julian the Apostate A.D. 362. — **Alexander and Antonina**, Martyrs.

11th – **SS. Bartholomew and Barnabas**, Apostles. Bartholomew is thought by many to be Nathaniel the “Israelite without guile” of St. John’s Gospel. He suffered death in Greater Armenia. His relics are enshrined in his church in Rome (Confer August 25). Barnabas was one of the SS. Seventy disciples. He labored with St. Paul of Antioch., Seleucia, etc., and is said to have been stoned to death by the Jews on the Isle of Cyprus.

12th – Our Venerable Father, **Onufrius the Great**, Hermit, lived alone for 60 years in the desert of Thebes. He died about A.D. 345, in the reign of Constantinus. Our Venerable Father, **Peter** of Athos.

13th – **St. Aquilina**, Martyr, suffered death A.D. 117, under the Emperor Trajan. **St. Trephillus**, Bishop of Levkusia in Cyprus, suffered at the hands of the Arians, especially because of his loyalty to St. Athanasius. He died about A.D. 370.

14th – **St. Elisha**, Prophet, was of the Tribe of Rubin and son of Saphath B.C. 816. On him fell the mantle of Elias and he continued the work of that great Prophet. In the age of St. Jerome, his grave in Samaria was shown as containing also the body of St. Abdias, the Prophet. He died in the 8th century B.C. Our Holy Father, **Methodius**, Patriarch of Constantinople, native of Sicily, was induced by the Empress Theodora to accept the See of Constantinople as successor to the Patriarch, Nicephorus. He was celebrated for his sanctity in the Episcopate of his successor, St. Ignatius. He died A.D. 846.

15th – **St. Amos**, Prophet, was the father of Isaias, the Prophet. Tradition says he was scourged and his temples pierced with an iron spike in the 8th century B.C. Venerable, **Jerome**, born at Stridonium in Dalmatia, was one of the most learned Doctors. He studied at Rome, visited centers of learning in Gaul and Greece, retired into the Desert of Syria for study and prayer, was ordained a priest at Rome, became confidant and advisor of Pope St. Damasus, and finally settled in Bethlehem. He died A.D. 420. He compiled the “Vulgate” edition of the Bible, which is used even now. **Translation of the Relics of our Father, Theodore “Sykeot”** A.D. 613, in the reign of the Emperor Heraclius.

16th – **St. Tychon**, Wonderworker, Bishop of Amathusa, was conspicuous for his detestation of idolatry and his care of the poor. He died about A.D. 450.

17th – **SS. Manuel, Sabel, and Ishmael**. Persian Martyrs. Christians, sent by their King, Baitan, to negotiate peace with the Emperor Julian, the Apostate. Tradition has it that Julian had them arrested, condemned, beheaded, and their bodies burned A.D. 362. — **SS Isaurus, Basil, Innocent, Jeremias, and others**, having concealed themselves in a cave at Appolonia in Macedonia in the 3rd century persecution, on being discovered were tortured and beheaded.

18th – St. Leontius, Martyr, suffered torture and death for Christ in Tripoli in Phoenicia about A.D. 76, in the reign of Vespasian, Emperor.

OUR HOLY FATHER AND WONDERWORKER TYCHON, BISHOP OF AMATHIS

Saint Tikhon was a miracle-worker. Following the death of Blessed Mnemonius, Tikhon was unanimously elected a bishop and consecrated by the renowned Epiphanius for the Diocese of Amathus. His purity of life and zeal for Orthodoxy recommended him for this office. There were still pagans on Cyprus at that time. With apostolic zeal, St. Tikhon undertook to convert the unbelievers into believers. In that, he had great success. After lengthy labor in the vineyard of the Lord, Tikhon took up habitation in blessed eternity about the year 425 A.D. He was called a miracle-worker because of the many miracles he worked during his life. Tikhon’s father was a baker. When his father left him alone in the store, he would distribute bread, free of charge, to the poor. Once, his father reproached him for this. Tikhon prayed to God and their granary was so filled with wheat that the door could not be opened without difficulty. Again, at another time, he planted withered branches of a vine and the vine became green and, in due time, brought forth fruit.

ST. AMOS, PROPHET

The Holy Prophet Amos, third of the Twelve Minor Prophets, lived during the eighth century before Christ. At this time, the Hebrew nation was divided into two kingdoms: Judea and Israel. The Judean King, Hosiah, ruled in Jerusalem, but the 10 separated Israelite tribes were ruled by Jeroboam II, an idol-worshipper. At Bethel, he set up an idol in the form of a golden calf, which they worshipped, after they rejected the God of Israel.

The Prophet Amos was a Judean, from the city of Thecua in the land of Zebulon. Simple and untaught, but fervent in faith and zealous for the glory of the true God, this former shepherd and dresser of sycamore trees (*Amos 7:14-15*) was chosen by the Lord for prophetic service. He was sent to the kingdom of Israel to denounce the impiety of King Jeroboam and also the Israelites for falling away from God. The prophet predicted a great misfortune, which would befall Israel and the neighboring pagan nations because of their impiety. As a result of his denunciations, the Prophet Amos repeatedly suffered beatings and torture. He returned to Bethel and, threatening inevitable misfortunes, he continued to call the Israelites to repentance.

The idolatrous priest, Amaziah, of the pagan temple, particularly hated the Prophet. The Prophet predicted speedy destruction for him, and all his household and, for this, he was subjected to beatings. Hosiah, the son of Amaziah, struck the saint on the head with a club and seriously wounded him. Still alive, the Prophet Amos reached his native village and died there around 787 B.C. He is not to be confused with Amos, the father of the Prophet Isaiah.
