- 27<sup>th</sup> **Pantaleon or Panteleimon,** The Great Martyr and Imperial physician, reckoned with St. Luke, Apostle, Patron of medical men. He suffered death by beheading about A.D. 303, during the reign of Maximian, Emperor. Our Venerable Mother, **Authusa,** mother of St. John Chrysostom. **St. Clement of Ochrid,** Wonderworker.
- 28<sup>th</sup> **SS. Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon and Parmenas**, Apostles and Deacons, four of the Seven Deacons spoken of in *Acts 6:5*: 'all having suffered death for Christ.' Our Holy Father, **Innocentius**, Pope of Rome. After many hardships, he died A.D. 417.
- 29<sup>th</sup> **St. Callinicus**, Martyr at Gangrae about A. D. 290. **SS. Seraphina**, Virgin-Martyr, **Theodotia and her Children**, of Syrian origin, adopted daughter of St. Sabina whom she had converted to Christianity at Rome, arrested and beheaded A.D. 122.
- 30<sup>th</sup> SS. Silas, Silvanus, Criscentus, Hepenetus and Andronicus, Apostles. St. John, soldier-Martyr, endured death in Caesarea of Cappadocia during the reign of Constantine and Galerius. St. Julitta, Martyr.
- 31<sup>st</sup> **St. Eudocimus,** Venerable, lived in the reign of the Iconoclast Emperor Theophilus.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Procession of the Venerable and Life-Giving Cross. Commemoration of the SS. Seven Machabee Brothers, Martyrs, their names being Abim, Antonin, Gurius, Eliazar, Eveson, Alim, Marcell and their mother, Solomonia, and their Master, Eleazer, martyred 173 B.C., during the reign of Antiochus, son of Seleucius.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Translation of the Holy Relics of St. Stephen, the first Martyr and Archdeacon from Jerusalem to Constantinople during the reign of the Emperor Constantine the Great A.D. 312. St. Stephen, Priest-Martyr, Pope of Rome, and Others with him, martyred A.D. 260, during the reign of Valerian and Gallienus, Emperors. Tradition alleges that he was beheaded while seated in his chair before the Altar in the Catacombs.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> **Our Venerable Fathers, Isaacius, Dalmatius, and Faustus.** Isaacius died A.D. 368, in the reign of Valens, Emperor. He had predicted the death of Valens, the Arian, going into battle. This prediction fulfilled, Dalmatius and Faustus died in the reign of Theodosius the Great, Emperor (379-395).
- 4<sup>th</sup> SS. Seven Youth of Ephesus, Martyrs, their names being: Maximilian, Dionisius, Amblichus, Martin, Antonin, John and Marcell. St. Eudokia, Venerable Martyr.

#### PROCESSION OF THE WOOD OF THE VENERABLE AND LIFE-CREATING CROSS

This feast was instituted by a mutual agreement of the Greeks and Russians at the time of the Greek Emperor, Manuel, and the Russian Prince, Andrew, in commemoration of the simultaneous victories of the Russians over the Bulgarians and the Greeks over the Saracens. In both of these battles, crosses were carried by the armies from which heavenly rays shone. It was, therefore, instituted that on August 1, the Cross be carried first to the middle of the Church of the Divine Wisdom [Hagia Sophia] and after that, along the streets for the people to venerate as a commemoration of the miraculous help of the Cross in previous battles. This was not an ordinary cross, but the true Honorable Cross, which was kept in the church of the imperial court. On July 31, the Honorable Cross was carried from the imperial court to the Church of the Holy Wisdom of God and, from there, it was carried along the streets for the consecration of the earth and the air. Finally, on August 14, it was again returned to the church of the imperial palace.

**THE SMALL BLESSING OF WATER:** Frequent blessing of water usually took place on the first day of the month. The blessing for August 1 is the only one retained in the Typicon. You may want to bring your own bottle and containers for water.

<u>THE DORMITION FAST</u>: The observance of the fast is voluntary from August 1-14, which traditionally, is a strict abstinence. It may be observed with abstinence from meat on Wednesdays and Fridays.

**SANCTUARY AND TRIPTYCHS LAMPS** – The Sanctuary and Triptychs Lamps are very special candles that remain perpetually lit to honor Our Lord Jesus' Eucharistic and Mystical Presence. If you are interested in sponsoring a vigil candle, the usual stipend is \$10.00. Forms will be in the back of the church. Please fill them out and, along with your stipend, place in the collection basket or see Fr. Milan.
